

SAMISH BAY BIVALVE BASH FAQ SHEET

What?

Celebrating the diversity and economic importance of shellfish grown in Samish Bay while drawing attention to the importance of clean water, the Samish Bay Bivalve Bash brings families and community together for some good old-fashioned summer fun featuring games, contests, shellacious food, beverage and local bands by the bay. Proceeds benefit the clean water efforts of the Skagit Conservation Education Alliance.

When?

Saturday July 29th 11:30 am to 8:00 pm.

Where?

Taylor Shellfish Samish Farm in Bow.

Can I bring my dog?

Sorry, no pets.

Parking?

Except for bicycles, All Bivalve Bash Parking is offsite at the Blanchard Chapel (3685 Legg Rd.). Parking for the event is free. [View Map.](#)

There will be Bivalve Bash signs directing you to offsite parking and shuttle busses.

Shuttles will run every 15-20 minutes. One bus is wheelchair accessible.

From the north, go south on Chuckanut Drive. 2.3 miles south of the Taylor Shellfish Farm entrance turn left on Colony Road. At the stop sign, turn left. Blanchard Chapel is just ahead on the right.

From the south, go north on Chuckanut Drive 8. 3 miles from I-5 exit #231 (or 1.5 miles north of Bow Hill Rd.). Turn right on Colony Road. At the stop sign, turn left. Blanchard Chapel is just ahead on the right.

Entry Fee?

The Festival Cover is \$5 per person.

Kids 6 and under and Mud Runners free.

Food?

There is additional cost for food and beverage. Food and beverage sales benefit the Skagit Conservation Education Alliance.

Sorry, coolers not allowed

Beverages?

Sodas, bottled water and coffee available. Beers from La Conner Brewing and the “Oyster Award” winning Geyser Peak Sauvignon Blanc are available in the Beer Garden. Must Be 21. Sorry, no coolers.

There will be some food items for her including corn, salad, berries and bread.

Family Activities?
